1. Current Horse I.D.s will be required for each horse used in the Rodeo. Coggins papers are not required.
2. All riders are to be in the Grand Entry.
3. All contestants will be assigned an official number upon arrival at the Fair Grounds.
4. All contestants must register with the Rodeo Secretary promptly upon arrival at the Fair Grounds and pick up official number.
5. **Dress Code:** Long sleeve shirt, long pants, boots, western hat (optional) -- no caps.
6. **Chute Doggin:** Time starts when steer clears chute gate. Steer cannot be thrown until it crosses the white line in arena. If the steer falls down himself, he must get up and be thrown again.
7. **Steer Riding:** Steer riders will be required to furnish their own equipment (riding rope, spurs, etc.) And must be ready when their name is called. Steer riding is timed and judged. Time requirements: Seniors - eight (8) seconds; Intermediate - six (6) seconds; Junior - six (6) seconds.
8. **Team Roping:** Total combination of three (3) loops. Contestants can participate in two (2) different teams -- must change partners or switch ends. One heel catch, add five (5) seconds. PRCA rules apply.
9. **Breakaway Roping:** Ropes will be attached to saddle with twine string. Head catch rope must pass over calf's head. Time stops when rope is pulled from saddle by calf. Ropers may carry two (2) loops or build a loop. Senior ropers must carry two (2) loops to use two (2) loops.
1. **Ribbon Roping:** Roper must have control of the calf before the tail is stripped. Team must be co-ed.
1. **Goat Tail Tying:** Ribbon must not be pre-tied. Goat must stay tied five (5) seconds.
- Goat Tying:** Goat must stay tied down five (5) seconds.
 Do not touch the goat after it is tied or you will be immediately disqualified. A horse may not touch the rope OR crossover the rope or the goat or you will be immediately disqualified.
2. **Barrels:** Touching a barrel with a hand shall cause immediate disqualification. A five (5) second penalty will be assessed for each barrel that is tipped over. Closed gate.
3. **Pole Bending:** AQHA pattern with six (6) poles. Closed gate. Touching a pole with a hand in order to set it up shall cause immediate disqualification.
14. All roping events have a one (1) minute time limit.
15. All speed events: horses must be at a walk when passing through the arena gate to start an event.
16. Only parental assistance to the arena gate will be allowed. Parents may not enter the arena.
17. Good conduct and sportsmanship will be expected of all contestants, parents/ guardians, and spectators. Failure to comply with Rules and Regulations will be cause for immediate disqualification.
18. No stallions are permitted!
19. No rider may enter the same event twice, except in team roping.
20. No refunds will be given for "no show" contestants or canceled classes.
21. No additions will be accepted, only cancellation of a class or classes.
22. The Rodeo Coordinator will have final say in all matters.

Tie-breaking Rules: If there is a tie for All Around Cowboy & Cowgirl, the tie will be broken by the individual who placed in the most events. If that results in a tie, then the tie will be broken by the individual who won the most 1st places in the events entered. If that results in a tie, then the tie will be broken by the individual who entered in the most events. And finally, if that results in a tie, then the tie will be broken by flipping a coin.

The following animal rights information shall apply to this Lyon County 4-H function: The Show superintendents and 4-H Project Coordinators have agreed that the word abuse includes: beating, slapping, use of injections and use of electric prods. These shall be deemed as inhumane treatment of animals and may warrant dismissal from this function. They may determine that any exhibitor who inhumanely abuses an animal may be barred from showing and will forfeit any premium, ribbon or prizes won. They have the right to interpret these rules in the best interest of the Lyon County 4-H Program. The decision of the Superintendents or Coordinators shall be final.
